

INVITATION TO LENTEN DISCIPLINE

Lent is a season of forty nights and days to prepare for the reconciliation renewing life. We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and forgiveness as demonstrated in the gospel of Jesus Christ. We begin our Lenten journey to Easter with the sign of the Cross in ashes. This ancient sign speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, while marking the desires of this community for reconciliation. I invite you therefore, in the name of Christ to a season of self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by works of compassionate love, by reading and meditating on the Word of God.

LITANY OF PENITENCE

L: Let us pray in our own voices and for the sins of our world.

P: Holy and merciful God, we confess to you, to one another, to the whole communion of saints, that we have sinned in thought, word and deed, by what we have done and by what we have chosen to leave undone making that impossible.

L: We have not loved you with our whole heart, mind and strength. We have exhausted our energy, intelligence, imagination and love. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

P: Have mercy on us,

L: We confess to you O God, the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience of our lives.

P: We confess to You, O GOD.

L: Our clinging to old wounds, our stiff-necked hard-heartedness over what is past and passed.

P: We confess to You, O GOD.

L: Our love of worldly goods, comforts and pleasures, and the dishonesties of daily life.

P: We confess to You, O GOD.

L: Our negligence to commend the faith that is in us to others.

P: We confess to You, O GOD.

L: Accept our repentance, O GOD, for the wrongs we have done. For the neglect of human need and suffering, for our indifference to cruelty. For all false judgements, uncharitable thoughts toward neighbors, prejudice and contempt for those who differ from us.

P: Accept our repentance, O GOD.

L: Restore us to a right Creation, O GOD, and let your anger depart from the world.

P: Favorably hear us, O GOD, for great is Your mercy.

OFFERING OF ASHES

Almighty God, according to Genesis, you created us out of the dust of the earth, and to dust we return. May these ashes be for us a sign of our mortality and penitence, a reminder that only by your gracious gift are we granted everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Savior.

SCRIPTURE

2nd Corinthians 5:20 – 6:12
